With these words the Isaiah prophecy sets a tone for the Midnight Mass and we're off and running to the light of Easter. Christmas to Easter, one quick and easy swoop. Not really a stretch at all if you stop to the think about.

In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, a year that gives us invitation for reconciliation even as it invites us to be reconciled, when we look behind the mercy we find joy. Both reconciling and giving or receiving mercy are natural pathways to joy. To reconcile is to lighten our hearts by letting go, by laying a burden down. To be merciful is to recognize that we have been given the gift of mercy to share with others, we have been given the power to be merciful.

The source of our power? The love of God as revealed in Jesus Christ. The message of Christmas – God has entered the world. The message of Easter – God has saved the world. While no one witnessed

the Resurrection, our image for it is one of light and brightness rising out of darkness (death). The image of the Christmas star is also one of brightness and light emerging out of the darkness of a world of sin, separated from God.

In both images, the light of Christ emerges to set us free, to shake things up, and to turn worldly ways on their ear. As we begin our 2016 ministry, which looks like we will see the construction of a new building for ministry, we must ask ourselves as a community, what is the light we bring to the darkness of our times. And if it is a question for our community, to answer the question we must each give individual thought and input to the answer. More than that, our community is called to engage with each other and share answers and build on the results of our process.

For the process in which we are engaging is faith sharing and faith building. It is the hallmark of being both a parish and campus ministry. We are called to engage with each other and trust... Christ. You thought

I was going to say engage and trust one another, didn't you? But that is not what forms a community. It is important for us to trust one another, but to trust Christ first is the hallmark of faith. To trust Christ to form us as a people is to take a step beyond selfishness and the "what can I get out of this," mentality. To put Christ first means we see what is bigger than ourselves, and we can see the challenge we need to rise to.

As a Christian community, the playing field is always about seeing the bigger picture – what is Christ calling us to? Not, what do we think Christ is calling us to? But by our actions and our choices to come together in so many different activities (that parish and campus ministries offer) are we looking for the clues about living and sharing the Christian Faith and making the evaluation necessary to move forward?

That's our quest in 2016 dear friends – let us look for the light, share the mercy, and discover where Christ is leading in all we do.



The Year of Grace - 2015, and 2016

Little did we suspect a year ago how fast life could change in the getting a church building department.

At Christmas 2014 there had been some discussion with Bishop Walkowiak about finding a location for the parish center closer to campus. By March of this year, there was a particular site - what is now 10144 42nd Ave, just south of the GVSU campus.

On July 31, 2015, the Diocese of Grand Rapids closed on the property.

Ever since purchasing the property we have been engaged in a much quicker dash to have a new building in place before Christmas 2016. The designs for the 6000 Lake Michigan Drive property have been adapted and expanded - especially as we note that proximity to campus will add numbers.

The expansion also includes space for a nursery; class, meeting and social rooms; even as the worship space can flex upward to 400 people. It will be a green campus with geothermal heating, carefully chosen materials and an eye to the future.

Most importantly, our goal of two ministries within one parish, who will care for and support each other in the faith even as we grow in our ability to share it and lead others to it; now will have a common roof, close to campus - a place we can all call home.
