 given or said in a way that shows you do not think you are better than other people

Today's Gospel contains a familiar parable from St. Luke about the Pharisee and tax collector praying in the Temple. We see the innate differences between the two men when we hear what it is they are praying about – one clearly more humble than the other. We are left with the words:

“...for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted.”

How often do you think about your own humility? In a world where we are trained to boast about ourselves in order to move up in our careers or social circles, humility can be something that has fallen to the back of our minds. Take some time today to think about what would change if you remember to be humble every day this week. Then... try it. You may find that it will leave more room in your hearts and mind for faith, for Christ.

Interested in joining the scrip program? It's easy to register and get started. Stop by the scrip table and pick up a blue information packet.

Did you know there are 5 ways to purchase scrip cards? This week, we will explain the two most used ways. Next week will be for those who use their computer or mobile device for shopping.

Give one a try...

Scrip Store:

Stop by the scrip table after the 8 or 10:30 a.m. Mass and choose from the cards we have in-stock or place an order and it will be ready the following Sunday. Need it sooner, talk to the scrip team and we may be able to get it sooner.

On-line:

Once you are registered, you will have the option to pay for your order on-line (known as presto-pay) or pay when you pick it up on Sunday at the scrip table. If you register for presto-pay, this can take 24-48 hours before it is active. On-line orders need to be placed prior to 8 a.m. every Tuesday in order to pick them up on Sunday.
