

The First Scrutiny: Water by Caitlin Cusack, Music Ministry

Immersion in the font of baptism brings much more than cleansing from sin. The water of baptism slakes our thirst for God and unites us to Christ, making us, like him, "living water"

Reflection

As only a master storyteller can, Jack Shea recasts the remarkable encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman in his book *An Experience Named Spirit*. He delves into the details: why the woman came to the well at noon and not at break of day like the other women; how she laughed "like a prisoner"; the hurts she bore under a calloused demeanor.

And in the end, after Jesus hears her story, after he meets her with compassion and absorbs her sorrow, dares even to share a cup of water with her—after all this, the woman returns to her village, where the townspeople observe that a miraculous transformation has taken place: Her laughter rises like a fountain of living water.
